TREASURER'S REPORT



In 2024, our members' continued loyalty and participation in the Credit Union was key in securing another successful year.

As of December 2024, your Credit Union's assets grew by 8.73% reaching over \$2.2 billion. This ranks L&N in the top 5% of all Credit Unions in the United States, according to asset size. Shares grew 9.20% for a total of \$1.92 billion and loans increased by 9.73% for a total of \$1.8 billion.

As in the past, L&N has maintained a strong foundation for its growth. We are proud to announce that we gave back \$43 million to our members in the form of dividends. Your Credit Union continued strong stewardship of financial resources, with expenses and delinquency well below NCUA peer comparison.



We look forward to 2025 with optimism and confidence.





SUPERVISORY COMMITTEE REPORT



The Supervisory Committee consists of five members appointed by the Board of Directors. The Committee's duties are to conduct a comprehensive annual audit of the Credit Union and other audits as necessary. The Supervisory Committee also performs a financial and management oversight role, independent of the Board of Directors, on behalf of the Credit Union membership.



In addition to the annual audit, quarterly audits are conducted by independent Internal Auditors who report directly to the Supervisory Committee. The Internal Auditors' main responsibilities are to assist the Supervisory Committee in ensuring that internal controls are in place and operating as intended, member assets are being safeguarded, and Credit Union policies and procedures are followed.

In 2024, your Credit Union's financial condition was found to be sound, safe and secure. It has been a privilege to represent the Supervisory Committee of L&N Federal Credit Union.

PRESIDENT/CEO'S REPORT



I am proud to announce that 2024 was another successful year for your Credit Union.

In 2024, L&N received top honors as the #1 Credit Union in Kentucky by Forbes and for the ninth consecutive year, L&N was named a "Best Place to Work In Kentucky". It is an honor to receive such high marks from both our members and our staff. We are thankful for our talented and dedicated employees, who remain committed to serving our members.

Financially, 2024 was a strong year for our Credit Union. Assets grew by 8.73%, reaching over \$2.2 billion, ranking L&N in the top 5% of all Credit Unions in the United States, according to asset size. Over \$162 million in deposits were added, increasing the total to over \$1.9 billion. Our loans increased by 9.73% for a total of \$1.8 billion. Over 9,000 new members joined L&N in 2024, bringing total membership to almost 117,000.

In 2024, we helped thousands of members purchase a home, a car, or assisted with a personal lending need. We provided our members with the most trusted and competitive products in the market and continued our efforts in surveying members to ensure we are giving the highest level of service possible. Through survey results, I am pleased to share that 100% of members surveyed during the year indicated they would definitely recommend L&N to family and friends. Additionally, 100% of surveyed members that recently closed a home loan with us, reported an exceptional experience in all areas of the mortgage process. We are proud of these results and will always strive to maintain this high level of service and member satisfaction.

We continued our commitment of providing convenient branch access for our members by opening our 24th branch location in LaGrange, Kentucky. This branch will help to better serve Oldham County and the surrounding area. In 2025, we will expand our branch network by opening a new branch in Fern Creek. The new branch will be located in Louisville, KY on Bardstown Road, between Ferndale and Beulah Church Road. To improve access and convenience for members, two longstanding branches will be relocated. Our Ft. Wright, KY branch located inside Walmart will relocate to a freestanding building at 3425 Valley Plaza Road, and our Hikes Point Branch, located in McMahan Plaza will move to a nearby freestanding building at 3909 Taylorsville Road, in Louisville. With these relocations, we will now be able to offer our members drive-thru banking and a great new space to conduct business.

In closing, I would like to thank our Board of Directors, management, staff and members. Your dedication and loyalty have made L&N one of the premier financial institutions in the region. We look forward to serving you in 2025.


MOVE KENTUCKY FORWARD
